

### SUN SAFETY CHECKLIST

Those working in agriculture are at a higher risk for skin cancer because of time spent in the sun. While the warmth of the sun feels good on the skin, it's important to take multiple steps to protect yourself from overexposure and reduce sun-related risks. Sun protection includes covering your body with clothing, wearing a hat with a full-brim, adequate sunscreen coverage, and sunglasses

Are you reapplying sunscreen every two hours, or more frequently with heavy sweating?			
Are you wearing sunglasses to protect the eyes?			
Are checking your skin periodically and talking to your doctor about any changes you see?			
Are employees trained how to protect themselves from the sun?			
Are you scheduling work that happens in direct sunlight to avoid peak hours?
