## RURAL FIREFIGHTERS DELIVERING AGRICULTURAL SAFETY AND HEALTH (RF-DASH)

#### The Problem:

People who work in agriculture are 8-10 times more likely to die on the job than the average U.S. worker. Inadequate numbers of safety consultants exist to assist farmers in making their farms safer.

#### The Solution:

The "Rural Firefighters Delivering Agricultural Safety and Health," or RF-DASH, project is training and equipping firefighters/EMS to help fill this need and spread ag health and safety knowledge to farmers in their service areas.

### THE IMPACT

- ⇒ RFDASH has been highlighted in a four-part series of Progressive Dairyman articles with a national audience.
- Over 40 firefighters/EMS have been trained as trainers in the program, including those from Wisconsin, Minnesota, New York, and Massachusetts.
- New trainers have started to train others and make their own presentations. This includes over 20 new participants in Wisconsin, Vermont, and Ohio.

Five-part classroom and hands-on training with easy to use, free tools.

- 1. Introduction to Agricultural Emergencies
- 2. **NFMCFarmMAPPER.com** a pre-plan map of farms to expedite response times in emergencies
- 3. **SaferFarm.org** a hazard analysis tool to recommend abatement of common farm hazards
- 4. Farm First Aid train bystanders on immediate response to an emergency while waiting for first responders
- 5. Approaching the Farm Community
