The Upper Midwest Agricultural Safety and Health Center (UMASH) is requesting assistance in developing strategies to address key issues developed at the UMASH Annual Forum: “Antimicrobial Resistance in Agriculture: Is it a worker health issue?”. UMASH is asking for pre-proposal applications for small partnership projects ranging from \$5,000 to a maximum of \$10,000 to build partnerships for the UMASH Emerging Issues Program.

UMASH is specifically interested in projects that:

- Address the key issues identified during the Forum. An executive summary of the key messages of the forum is available
- Form new partnerships from multiple sectors
- Focus on specific solutions and vulnerable populations
- Show promise of leading to a larger sustainable effort

At this time we are calling for pre-proposals. Interested investigators should send a one-page summary of their proposed idea to umash@umn.edu addressing the following points:

- Specific issue or opportunity to be addressed
- How it relates to the agricultural workforce.
- Organizations and individuals involved
- Expected outcome
- Potential for future funding to extend this work and potential funding sources
- Approximate cost (non-binding)

The pre-proposals will be reviewed and selected applicants will be invited to submit a full (3 page) proposal. UMASH is willing to work with the applicants as necessary to develop the final project plans.
