

SKID STEER SAFETY CHECKLIST

Skid steers are a common and critical piece of equipment on the farm. With moving buckets, blind spots, and varying centers of balance, these machines can be dangerous to operators and bystanders despite the productivity benefits. While they pose hazards like pinch points, runovers, and entrapment, safe operation is possible.

You and/or your employee(s) can use this form to complete safety checks on your farm. Use the form below to list additional safety checks you think are important when inspecting your farm. Is a seatbelt and restraint bar used at all times during operation?			
Is the machine inspected before use, ensuring handholds, safeguards, fittings, and hydraulic hoses are in good repair?			
Has the machine been disinfected between operators? If so, how <u>frequently</u> and with <u>what</u> ?			
Is there a standard operating procedure for the operator and additional workers when using the skid steer (that accounts for physical distancing)?			
Does the operator enter with 3 contact points, the loader arms down, and brakes set?			
Is the machine up to date on maintenance? Clean of debris, no smooth tires, bucket is hooked/locked, etc.			
Is the machine free of passengers? Passengers, including small children, interfere with control, vision, and may bounce out.			
Does all operation occur exclusively within the cab?			
Does the operator know the field of vision and blindspots?			
Are bucket loads secure, within the limit, distributed evenly?			
Is the operator trained on controls, safety, hazards and 16 years or older?			
Do you have regular safety training or 'toolbox talks' (virtually or with physical distancing) with operators and workers about hazards and safe work practices while operating or working around skid steers?
