AGRITOURISM: THE NEW FRONTIER

The Problem:

Agritourism events, like school field trips, petting zoos, and county fairs, provide an agricultural experience, but can place people at risk of illness and injury, particularly for disease transmission between animals and people. Financial and legal consequences can also impact both visitors and the owner/operator. Implementing safety practices to reduce the risk of injury or illness to visitors is becoming increasingly important.

The Solution:

UMASH, in partnership with the Minnesota
Department of Health, has developed a variety of
resources to help farmers and agritourism operators
keep visitors safe. The training provides education
to county fair board and farms hosting agritourism
events. Outreach efforts engaged farm safety
champions that have amplified these resources and
the need for health and safety on the farm.

- Five online agritourism safety videos, including:
 - » Two new videos for 4H clubs on food safety and biosecurity when exhibiting livestock.
- ⇒ Safer Farm Animal Contact Exhibits (Safer FACEs) online certification program for venue operators.
- □ 14 Healthy Fairs and Agritourism workshops across the state with a total of 326 participants
- □ Featured on Extension websites, newsletters and blogs.
- Partnerships with state agencies including the Department of Agriculture, Environmental Health and the Board of Animal Health.
- Partnered with North Star Farm Tour to create multi-lingual materials for 20 farm tours to promote handwashing and best practices in animal settings.













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
